Notes from the Chair

1st April 2019 is significant not just for being the day we leave the EU but also because it is the date when HMRC require all VAT registered businesses with a taxable turnover above the VAT registration threshold (£85,000), to maintain digital records. This will apply to their first VAT period with a start date after 1st April 2019.

In order to support farming and rural businesses, the Hub has already run a number of workshops in Herefordshire and Gloucestershire, in conjunction with Fastershire's Faster Farmers initiative. Over 130 people have attended and have been assisted in the understanding of the implications and preparation for the changes in record keeping.

Further support will be available at the **Rural Business Advice Day** on **21st November**, so if Making VAT Digital is going to affect you, make a date in your diary to come along. There will be a presentation on the topic plus one-to-one drop in sessions. There's no need to book and the day is also a great chance to catch up on other topical issues including planning, farming post-Brexit, future farm environmental proposals, crime prevention and asset protection.

We'll be at The Three Counties Hotel, Belmont Road, Hereford, HR2 7BP between 12 noon and 6.00pm on Wednesday 21st November 2018.

The Prince's Farm Resilience Programme

Family farm businesses are invited to register for the third year of The Prince's Farm Resilience Programme. **An area which is in an approximate 30 miles radius from the city of Worcester is one of the chosen locations. The programme will be delivered by Herefordshire Rural Hub. Up to 20 farming families are invited to join the highly successful initiative.**

Aimed at dairy, beef, and sheep farmers, it helps farming families to make changes to improve their business and ensure their viability. 83% of participating farmers said they have made greater efficiencies because of taking part, and 9 in 10 say they feel more confident for the future of their business.

Support is provided through one-to-one on farm advice, as well as a series of group workshops delivered by professional consultants, including Kite, The Andersons Centre, Promar, Savills, and Saviour Associates. This year sees a new selection of workshops based on feedback from participating farmers in year one and two.

This year's workshops include:

- **The Business Health Check** – a simple benchmarking exercise carried out on farm, after which the anonymised results are reviewed to show the importance of keeping and using records
- **Practical cost management** – exploring ways of making efficiencies and practical cost-saving techniques
- **Getting to know your finances** – how accounts are put together, and how they can advise your decision making on-farm
- **Business planning and managing change** – encouraging families to look at their farm businesses, to identify short- and long-term aims, SWOT analysis, and how to manage change
- **Planning for your Future** – this looks at how to engage the whole family in succession planning and future proofing your business
- **Managing your environment** – looking at environmental recording and benchmarking, identifying your public goods, and opportunities and advice around farming in harmony with the environment

Applications are open until Monday 15th October and places are allocated on a first come first served basis.

The Rural Payments Agency has announced a derogation to relax some of the Ecological Focus Area (EFA) rules to increase the availability of fodder. This specifically applies to EFA **cover crops** only. The derogation is expected to come into force by 30th September.

Update from the Wye & Usk Foundation

Pesticide Project:

We are still out and about visiting fields identified by Severn Trent as high risk for metaldehyde use and providing advice on pesticide handling and disposal. If you would like help to improve your pesticide handling area please get in contact.

New Natural Flood Management Project:

Funded by the Environment Agency & Herefordshire Council we will be providing advice and support to farms in target catchments that could help to reduce flooding of properties downstream. This could involve addressing compaction issues in your soil, using cover crops to protect bare ground, holding back water in streams, tree planting – all sorts of options. We will be working in the following streams over the coming months: Cheaton, Ridgemore, Bodenham, Pentaloe, Red, Twyford, Tedstone, Dulas and Yazor. The Prince's Countryside Fund

The Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) working in partnership with Herefordshire Rural Hub have secured funding to provide support for training in a **rurally based career** to the end of December 2019. The funding is easy to access. All you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim **70%** of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of **£250**. **Applicants must be a current member of HFYFC or a past HFYFC member (up to 40 yrs old).**

The fund will support training that will; **improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.**

Some examples of training that has been funded so far:-

B+E Trailer, Chainsaw Certification, Pesticide Applications, Shearing, Artificial Insemination, Tractor Driving, Forklift Truck Driving

You could even apply for funding towards a **Rodent Control** course

Whatever training you are applying for, **please ensure that you submit your application in good time before your course is due to take place, as training cannot be funded retrospectively.**

Please note, the appraisal panel meets on the first Monday of the month.

The Jack Hughes Fund - administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation

RDPE Countryside Productivity Scheme

Funding for projects in England which improve productivity in the farming & forestry sectors & help create jobs and growth in the rural economy. It is administered by the RPA. Under the RDPE Countryside Productivity Scheme, there are grants for:

Improving Farm Productivity (application deadline 3rd December 2018)

Grants to fund projects that improve farm productivity through the use of robotic equipment and systems to aid crop and livestock production; increasing the use of renewable energy produced on farm; the use of LED wavelength controlled lighting to aid crop production; more efficient use of livestock slurries and manures, and digestate.
