News from DEFRA

DEFRA have published [Farming for the Future: Policy Progress and Update on GOV.UK](#). This provides detail on the Environmental Land Management (ELM) scheme and our other planned schemes to support productivity, animal health and welfare. It also covers future support for innovation and research and development.

DEFRA have also launched the [Environmental Land Management \(ELM\) Policy Discussion Document](#) on the Citizen Space website. This document sets out our initial thinking on the design of the new ELM scheme. **There are key questions in the document on which they would like your views.** Feedback on this document will help shape the new scheme.

General licences

DEFRA have announced that six general licences for the control of wild birds will be reissued on a temporary basis ahead of new licences coming into force on 1 August 2020. The licences will be reissued from 1 March to 31 July.

No action is required by licence users beyond the ongoing requirement to act in accordance with the licence conditions. Defra intends to publish new licences in early July to allow users to become acquainted with the changes before they officially come into force on 1 August.



Following its success in 2019 Welsh Water/Dwr Cymru have re-launched the **free and confidential pesticide disposal scheme** for farmers and land managers in England and Wales

HOW IT WORKS

1. **Register** with Dwr Cymru/Welsh Water online or by phone.
2. **They will confirm if you're eligible.** They will do this by asking you some simple questions.
3. **They will transfer your details.** If you're eligible, they will securely transfer your details to their third party contractor.
4. **Collection.** The contractor will ask what you want to dispose of, how much you have and arrange a collection date.

Free Advice and Farm Visits



Countryside Stewardship –Water and Air Quality Visits

The application window for CS is now open and will close on 31st July 2020. CSF can offer advice and endorsement for **priority farms** within the Wye catchment on water and air quality options and capital works. If you would like further advice, or to enquire whether your farm is a priority holding please contact your Catchment Sensitive Farming Officer (CSFO)

Air Quality Advice

Following the launch of Defra’s Clean Air Strategy earlier this year, CSF offers advice and events on improving air quality and reducing ammonia emissions, in addition to their current advice on water quality. If you are a dairy, beef or free range poultry unit (less than 40,000 birds) and would be interested in hearing more, please contact your local Catchment Sensitive Farming Officer (CSFO).

Specialist Advice Visits

Catchment Sensitive Farmers Officers (CSFO) are now able to offer around thirty different specialist advice visits for priority farms within the Wye catchment. Several of these are new to the project, having been designed to meet industry demands.

These include:

Assessment and Monitoring of Soil Health - An in-depth assessment of soil health through a combination of approaches, including detailed soil nutrient analysis, profile and field examination. Recommendations will be provided to help improve soil condition, increase plant growth and reduce erosion, weed, pest and disease problems, while improving air and water quality.

Water Resources Audit - Would you like to improve your farm’s resilience to drought, regulatory changes and identify options for the most effective water storage and efficiencies? This new visit will advise on water resource risks and make detailed, farm-specific recommendations on options to ensure water resilience and efficiency.

Woodland for Water and Air - This visit will investigate whether woodland creation or management on your farm could provide additional benefits for water and air quality, as well as business opportunities (e.g. wood fuels, stock shelter). Bespoke advice will also be given on location and design of woodland or tree planting, and available grants

Here's an update on the projects we have running in Herefordshire!

Natural Flood Management: Flooding is rather topical after the last few weeks... Our advisers are still working with landowners in target catchments to help deliver NFM interventions. There is still grant available to support delivery of recommendations and so far this has funded grassland aeration, subsoiling, cover cropping, attenuation ponds, hedge planting and leaky dams. The target catchments are the Dulas, Bodenham, Pentoloe, Tedstone, Cheaton, Ridgemore, Yazor and Red/Twyford Brook. Pesticides: Severn Trent Water are funding their **STEPS Grant Scheme** in the Wye for the first time this year. It is restricted to the **Drinking Water Safe Guarding Zone** which follows the main rivers so if you farm on the main stem of the Wye, Lugg or Frome and would like to improve a pesticide handling area or biobed/biofilter please contact Mike or Abi on the details below. STEPS is a competitive scheme and the application window reopens in November. The scheme can also support biodiversity options like buffer strips, winter bird food and pollen mixes.

Water Quality: The levels of phosphate in the rivers and streams is still higher than it should be and we are working hard to support local farmers to reduce losses from agricultural sources – which still contributes 50% of the P in our rivers. We are able to provide free confidential farm advice for any yard or land management challenges you may be facing. We can provide soil structure assessments, OM testing, yard advice, stewardship advice... the list goes on!

The Jack Hughes Fund - administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation

From September 1st 2019 the Jack Hughes Fund has been extended to staff aged over 40 years working on a Herefordshire farm. The amount of funding available still remains up to a maximum of £70% of the course cost but has been increased to an overall maximum of £200.

The programme is available for farmers and farm staff aged over 40 (limited to one family member/employee per farming business per year).

It will specifically provide funds to support those who require:

- retraining or upskilling as they are leaving the industry
- training to support a new farm diversification enterprise
- training or business support for succession planning

Funding will also be available for farm related training courses (examples below)

- Safe use of pesticides – PA1, PA2, PA6
- Rodent control on farms
- Emergency first aid
- Food safety (Basic Food Hygiene)
- Chainsaw Maintenance & Cross Cutting (CS30)

Other courses will be considered on application

The funding is easy to access, but please note that the project will not support training retrospectively & places will be limited. Applicants need to be resident in Herefordshire.

The Prince's Countryside Fund – still open for applications

The Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) working in partnership with Herefordshire Rural Hub have secured funding to provide support for training in a **rurally based career**. The funding is easy to access. All you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim **70%** of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of **£250**. Applicants must be a current member of HFYFC or a past HFYFC member (up to 40 yrs old).

The fund will support training that will; *improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.*

Some examples of training that has been funded so far:- **B+E Trailer, Chainsaw Certification, Pesticide Applications, Shearing, Artificial Insemination, Tractor Driving, Forklift Truck Driving, Rodent Control** and many more

Now onto a subject that means a lot to me and I know it will to you too, and that is the impact crime has on the person. I commend to you an anonymous survey being conducted by Harper – Adams, please, please, please give it some of your time.

Research into the psychological impact of Farm Crime in the UK

A new anonymous research survey has been launched to gather data on the wider implications of farm crime across the UK. While many reports talk about the effect farm crime has on the financial and business aspect of farming, this is the first piece of academic research to address the psychological impact farm crime has on victims. **Click [HERE](#) for more information**
